Additionally, students embark on routine field trips to visit colleges and immerse themselves in the surrounding communities.

COLLEGE/CAREER

Students participate in a college and career curriculum which includes interest inventories, college selection and application assistance, PSAT/SAT testing, college visits, and more!

TRAVEL ABROAD

Every other year, high school students embark on global adventures. Dual credit options are also on offer. Students spent 12 days exploring Greece and Italy in 2024 and their next adventure is scheduled for 2026.

SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT

Students engage in three weekly Chapel services celebrating our Episcopalian identity. High School students assume leadership roles during these services, while the other two days are dedicated to Christian Character Education, fostering discussions on ethics and morality, emphasizing our 3 R's: Reverence for God, Respect for Others, and Responsibility for Self. This, combined with Service Learning and our Biblical Studies program, plays a pivotal role in students' spiritual growth within their CEP journey.

NOURISH & FLOURISH

Monthly, students convene during lunch to gain insights from professionals in diverse fields about their career journeys. These sessions cover educational paths, encountered obstacles, and vital soft skills for success. Past speakers have included an Apple project director, a cybersecurity expert, a plastic surgeon, an attorney, architect, lawyer, engineer and more!

SERVICE LEARNING

At CEP, the essence of service learning is cultivating a compassionate spirit and a commitment to community betterment. Over four years, students are tasked with amassing 120 hours of community service through school-based or self-initiated activities. To foster deeper connections and understanding, a minimum of 60 hours must be dedicated to a single field.
