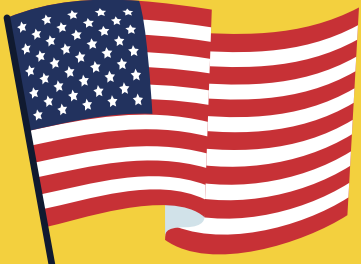
ASL Concert

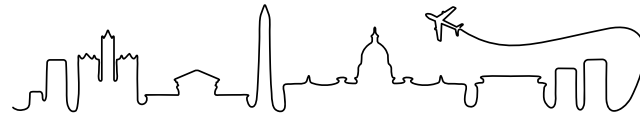


WASHINGTON, D.C. - 8th Grade

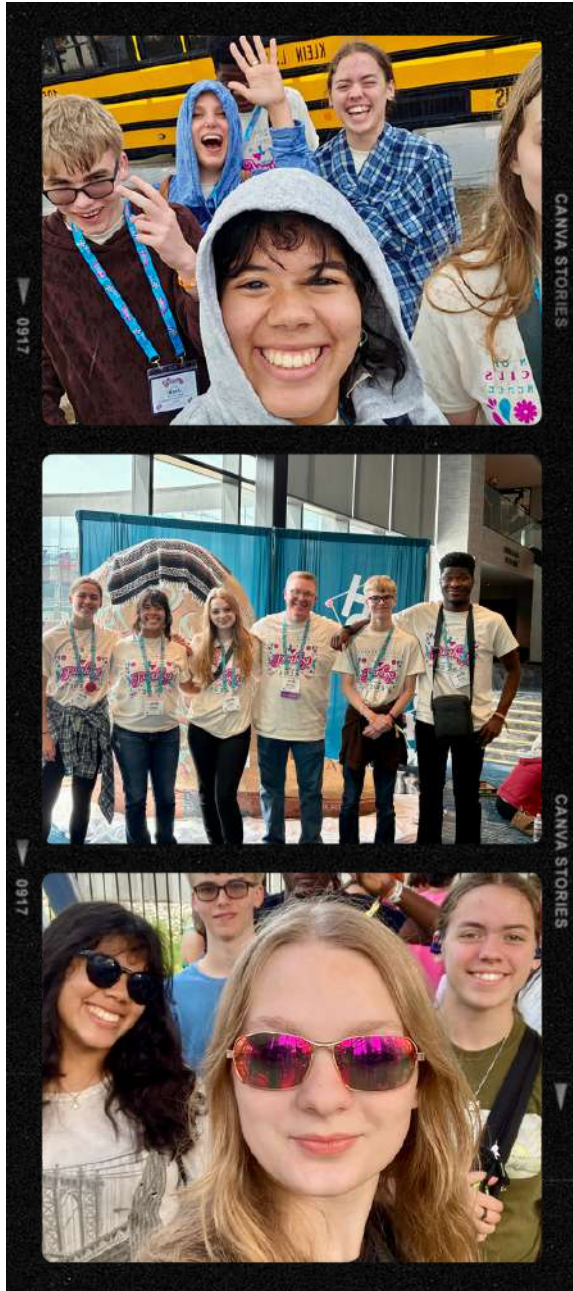
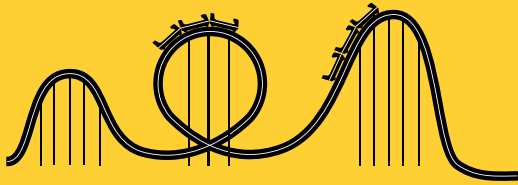

-OLOGY DAYS

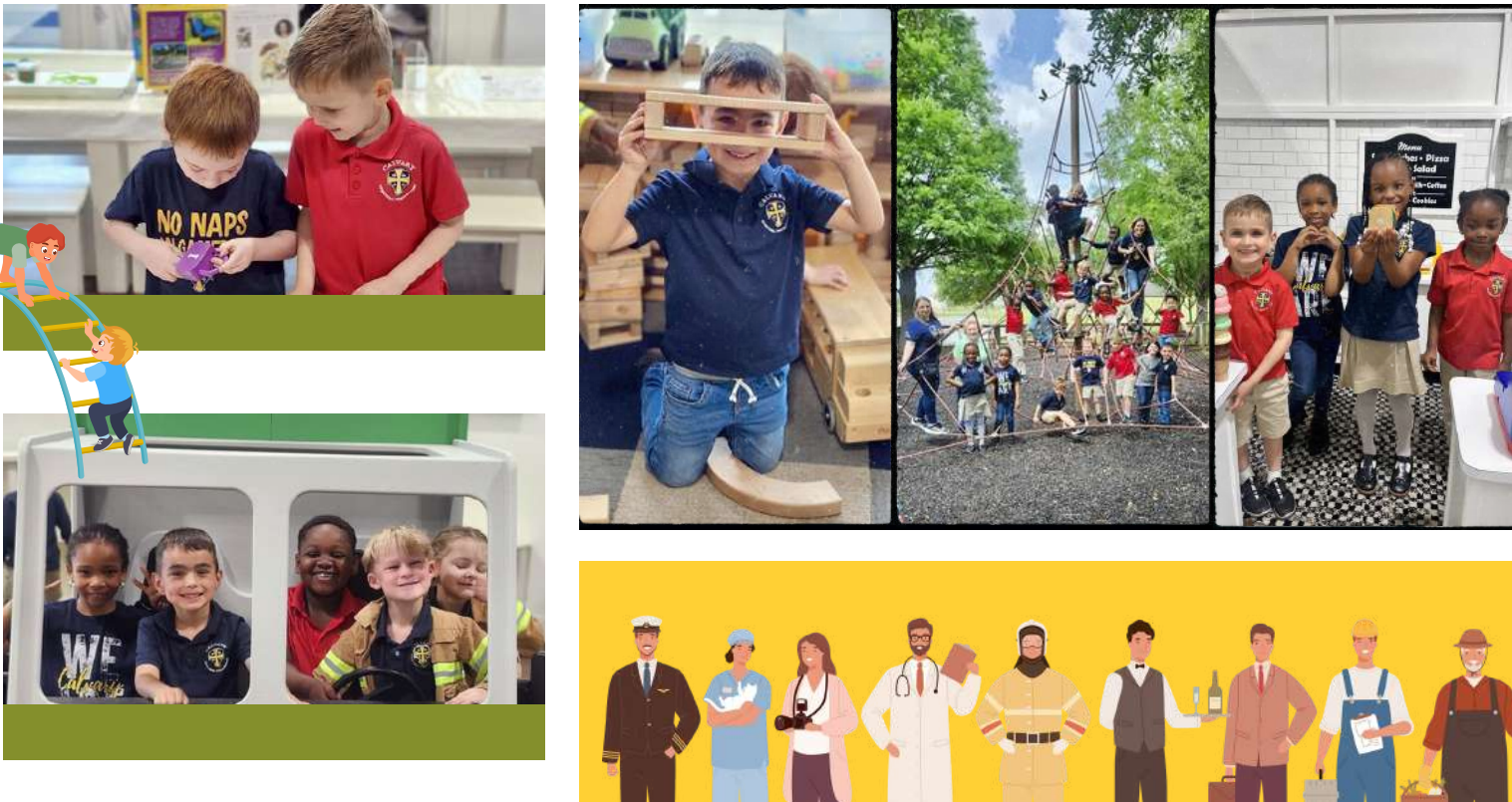

The 6th grade World Bazaar was full of fun facts, food, and information about student-chosen countries. These students worked hard preparing for this fun and educational evening.





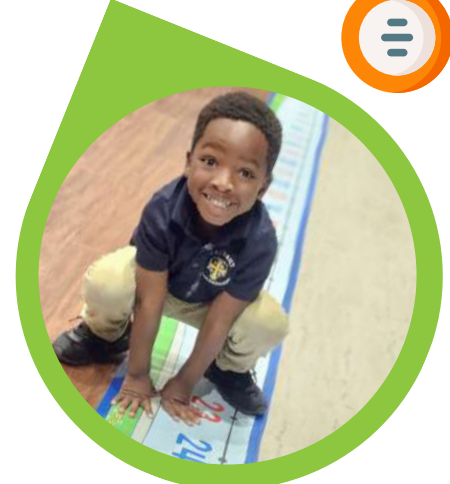

National Crayon Day

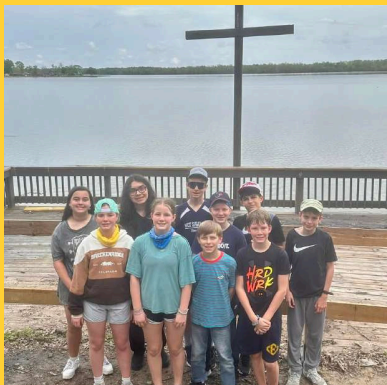

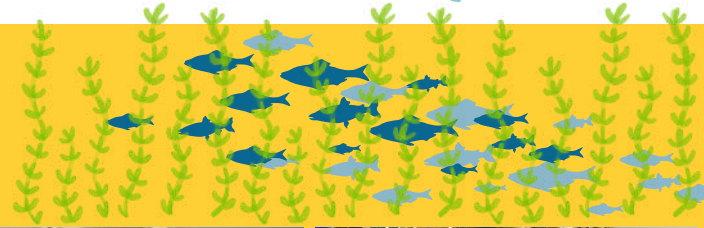
PK4 Field Trip

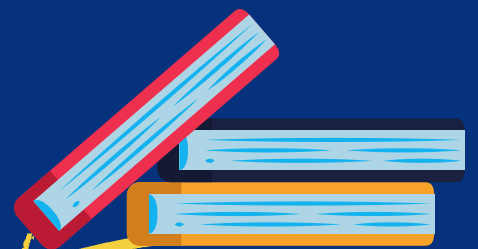
