Fostering social connections and a strong sense of community is integral to Calvary's high school program. Students engage in after-school activities such as escape rooms, roller-skating nights, and plays. The pinnacle of these events includes the High School trip to Camp Allen and the prom. Additionally, students embark on routine field trips to visit colleges and immerse themselves in the surrounding communities.

COLLEGE/CAREER

Students receive comprehensive college and career preparation, including guidance with college selection and applications, PSAT & SAT testing, college visits, college fairs, and career guest speakers.

TRAVEL ABROAD

Every other year, students embark on global adventures—2026 includes Ireland and Iceland. These experiences foster growth and independence. Students fundraise for the trip, which builds commitment. This experience enhances academic and cultural learning.

SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT

Students engage in three weekly Chapel services celebrating our Episcopalian identity. High School students assume leadership roles during these services, while the other two days are dedicated to Christian Character Education, fostering discussions on ethics and morality, emphasizing our 3 Rs: Reverence for God, Respect for Others, and Responsibility for Self. This, combined with Service Learning and our Biblical Studies program, plays a pivotal role in students' spiritual growth within their CEP journey.

NOURISH & FLOURISH

Monthly, students convene during lunch to gain insights from professionals in diverse fields about their career journeys. These sessions cover educational paths, encountered obstacles, and vital soft skills for success. Past speakers have included an Apple project director, a cybersecurity expert, a plastic surgeon, an attorney, an architect, a lawyer, an engineer, and more!

SERVICE LEARNING

At CEP, the essence of service learning is cultivating a compassionate spirit and a commitment to community betterment. Over four years, students are tasked with amassing 120 hours of community service through school-based or self-initiated activities. To foster deeper connections and understanding, a minimum of 60 hours must be dedicated to a single field.
